

Vailog Songjiang Logistics Park (120,000 m²) breaks ground in Shanghai, China

On June 25, 2008, Vailog held a groundbreaking ceremony for the construction of its Songjiang Logistics Park, which will be leased to its customer ST-Anda (Toll Group). The first phase of the new Logistics Park will develop 80,000 m² of modern distribution space in the District of Shanghai (30 km Southwest of Shanghai). Representatives from the local administration, from ST-Anda and from LaSalle Investment Management attended the ceremony.



The new Logistics Park covers an area of around 200,000 m² and has a total development capacity of 120,000 m². It is located just 3 km from the A5 motorway, 8 km from the A8 motorway and 12 km from Hongqiao International Airport. The site is also conveniently connected to other major cities of the Yangtze-river Delta area, through the local ring roads and expressway system.



The new facility for ST-Anda will be built with the highest technical specifications for modern logistics: the warehouse has a clear height of 10.5 m and will be equipped with a high number of dock-levellers in every fire section.

As a leading 3PL operator on the Chinese market, ST-Anda provides logistics services with a distribution coverage of 1,338 cities across China. Its major clients include Johnson & Johnson, Unilever, Wal-Mart, and Colgate Palmolive.

Close to Songjiang Industry Park (with highest industry output in the Shanghai area), Vailog Songjiang Logistics Park is located within a local government scheme dedicated to logistics, which is expected to become a major logistics base on national level. Along with other new projects in the Shanghai area (Jiading, Minhang,...), the start of the Songjiang Logistics Park increases Vailog's presence in the competitive logistics market of Shanghai.



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
